## Advocate Document Of 1836

April 12, 1912

Councillor Davison of Halfway River placed in our hands the other day an interesting old document bearing the date of March 24, 1836, a list of the 53 inhabitants of that part of Parrisboro called Advocate Harbour district for the purpose of collecting the sum of eleven pounds and one shilling taxes from the said inhabitants. It was signed by James W. Ratchford and James Fullerton, both Justices of the Peace.
